For God and Country. Roger Kelly **SERVICE OFFICER:** In the month of December we submitted 31 claims, spoke to 113 veterans, drove 884 miles and logged 255 hours. Thank you to all our volunteers that spend so much of their time doing good for our veterans and family. Military Widows Tax Elimination Act of 2019 Spouse SBP annuitants subject to the DIC offset won't see the first change in their payments until the Feb. 1, 2021, payment. You do not need to notify your pay agency that your SBP payment is affected by this change in the law. The pay agencies know who you are — they are docking your SBP now. Make sure your SBP account information is up to date and includes your correct mailing address so pay agencies can contact you. Establish a DFAS "myPay" or a USCG "Direct-Access (DA) Self-Service" account now and add your email address if you aren't already on DFAS or the USCG online programs (learn more at DFAS.mil for DoD or https://www.dcms.uscg.mil/ppc/ras/ for Coast Guard). Pay agencies cannot provide individual estimates of spouse SBP annuity payments at this time. Please do not call their Customer Service Centers to request an individual estimate. Survivors will not have to pay back any premium refunds if you previously received a refund of SBP premiums due to the SBP-DIC offset. The "Repeal of Authority for Optional Annuity for Dependent Children" and "Restoration of Eligibility for Previously Eligible Spouses" in the law only affects those spouses and children of servicemembers who died on active duty when the surviving spouse previously elected to transfer the SBP annuity to a child or children. They do not affect previous or future SBP elections by retirees or SBP annuities for a retiree's beneficiaries. The law is not retroactive, so there will not be any back payments for past offset amounts. The law starts as of the law's passage and going forward. Post Service Officer Claims Hours of Operation. As SAL Detachment Commander I attended "The Day on the Hill" in Richmond on January 15th. The JLC presented several proposed House Bills and Senate Bills to the Virginia legislature. All bills are designed to better the lives of Veterans in Virginia. The Legion and other VSOs successfully won support for various enactments to help Veterans and their families and we expect all to be passed. Our Aunt Ginny's Chicken and Dumplins' was a smash hit in January and another sell out due to your support of our SAL charity fund. Our dinner in February is the weekend of the Legion State Bowling Tournament hosted by Post 327. The Sons dinner night is Saturday **February 22nd** instead of the 3rd Friday of the month. The Sons will be cooking Steak that Saturday Night. SAL Ben Ski is the Chef and he knows how to cook! For only \$12.00 you get a Juicy Steak, Big Baked Potato, Salad, Roll and Dessert. Last year we cooked 90 steaks, and all were eaten, and everybody's appetite was sated. Jane Evans asked me to remind you again that the chili cook off is February 1st. 1st Vice Cmdr. Dave Samson wanted me to convey his appreciation for your membership renewals and recruitment. Our February goal is 75%. **VAVS/VSO:** I attended the VAVS quarterly meeting January 8th at the HVAMC. There I learned of all the exciting developments of facility undergoing at Hampton's VA Medical Center as well as on the Southside. The HVAMC is expanding the Dialysis section with a completion date of April 2020. SCI has been expanded and the DOM is adding on 2000 sq. ft. A new MRI section will open in March 2020. The CBOC in Chesapeake has been doubled in size from 10000 sq. ft. to 20000 sq. ft. while the CBOC in Virginia Beach has been increased in square footage by 60 %. Down the pike the GSA has approved a future 155000 sq. ft. Health Care Center #1 centrally located between Va. Beach, Chesapeake and Portsmouth. This will greatly facilitate Veteran's care on the Southside and help alleviate the overburden to Hampton VA Medical Center. Target date for completion is August 2024. The GSA has also approved a 210000 sq. ft. Health Care Center#2 to service the Suffolk-Portsmouth area. The completion date is sometime in 2026.

I was able to present a \$500.00 quarterly check from the Post to Volunteer services that went to 5 different funding accounts. Distribution was \$100.00 per account. These are the accounts: Social Work, VAVS Committee, Drug

Abuse, Country Fair and Recreation Therapy. I thank all for the donated calendars. I took the calendars over to the HVAMC January 15th after coming back from Richmond's "The Day on the Hill". If you still have extra calendars bring them in because I was told they can use more.
