SQUADRON COMMANDER: Greetings Legion Family It is truly a remarkable organization that we belong to whereby we can associate ourselves together for the common good. Our focus is on helping and aiding our Veterans and families that may need a little assistance. There is a myriad of Legion programs available to help. We have National Emergency Fund (NEF) that can issue emergency funds in times of dire needs caused by a storm, flood, hurricane or tornado. NEF is available to any member of the Legion Family (Legionnaire, Auxiliary or SAL). Funds are issued after a State of Emergency has been declared by the Governor of the State or by the President. These funds help Legion victims to stay above water (no pun intended). It may help to put on a new roof on a house ripped off by a storm and/or money to use for temporary shelter and food and clothing.

There is the Veteran & Children Foundation (VCF) formally the Legion Endowment Fund. The Endowment Fud was first established in 1925. The name has been changed to Veteran & Children Foundation. The NEC deemed that a new moniker should be adopted to better describe what this charity program does. VCF raised over \$4.2 million dollars just from 2012 to 2016 to be issued as grants. I do not have more recent dollar amounts contributed since 2016. These grants are given to Veteran families with minor children as Temporary Financial Assistance (TFA) that may be facing homelessness, hunger, loss of utilities due to financial crisis or disaster. VCF funds also are given to VA&R and are used to help train and educate our Service Officers who help Veterans process thousands of claims per year for their qualified entitlements and benefits through the Government and the Veterans Administration. I know a lot of you are familiar with the Children's Welfare Foundation (CWF). By the Way the Sons nationally have raised over \$8 million dollars for CWF.

There are a lot more ways that we members help our compatriots, neighbors and our communities.

There is Operation Comfort Warrior (OCW). We have the Fisher House where financially deprived families can stay free while their loved one is hospitalized. We donate to the Food Bank, Union Mission, local schools, etc.

All this diatribe is only meant to illustrate for you how important and how much we SAL depend on your generous donations to our SAL Charity Fund. Our SAL monthly dinners raise money and we also raise money from other fundraising activities. Dues is a very large percentage of our money raised.

Contribution is not always monetary. For example,

We decided since it is cold to serve a generous portion of Homemade Beef Stew with a Grill Cheese Sandwich and Dessert.
