Having completed my first Yearly Impact report, it's amazing to total up all the data and see the full picture of all the great things Unit 327 does, which involves those that volunteer outside of the Post home as well as in. With the information received, Unit 327 spent over 6000 hours volunteering in all these various ways and more. Unit Fundraisers, donations, materials, and monies donated by Unit members for our charities were wonderful this year, with all totaling approximately 18K in donated funds and homemade hats, scarves, blankets, baby blankets and hats, masks and shawls. We were able to donate all of these going out to out to the charities, number one of which was our VAMC Hampton, the USO, Navy Marine Corps Relief, Our Military Kids, ForKids, CASA Norfolk, The Chapel of the 4 Chaplains, Edmarc Hospice, Fisher House, Lee's Friends, Honor and Remember, HER Women's Shelter, 6 local elementary schools, churches, the NEST program (Norfolk Emergency Shelter Team) and others. The biggest change this year were masks due to COVID, our own Anne Starke made thousands of masks that went to health care workers, first responders, schools, Veterans Hospitals, and

communities around the country and to other countries. We hope to be able to capture even more of the good works that the Unit members are doing in the future. We only received information from around 50 of our 236 members so hopefully next year we can capture more of the good works done by all. The Easter Basket Drive through was a great success and we passed out 91 baskets, almost doubling the amount of goodie bags passed out at Halloween. Thanks to our Easter Bunny, Yvonne! She did a fabulous job and posed for pictures with some of the kids. And thanks to Otha Newton for taking the pictures and bringing smiles to the children. Also, thanks to all the volunteers that helped make this a success and thanks to Post 327 for donating all of the baskets and candy to be passed out. A BIG thanks to Tommy for the wonderful dinner at our April Fundraiser dinner, selling a total of 84 dinners! We were able to send out 188 pounds of socks, Chapstick, personal care items, snacks, etc. to the troops in April. This was a huge number of donated items and a card was sent with each box and they will be disbursed to the troops when received. Our May dinner is celebrating Cinco De Mayo with homemade Chicken Enchiladas and all the fixings by Bob DeChamplain. We have been contacted again by the Historians that notified us of the French Sailors at St. Marv's and we are now working with a French Admiral stationed here at NATO to have a ceremony honoring them on May 19th at the cemetery with the French sailors that will be in town on that day as it is the French National Day of the Sailor. Many of the Legion family showed up at Ocean View Park on the 29th to support the Run for the Fallen.
