SERVICE OFFICER: Effective September 30, 2025, and to the extent permitted by law, the Secretary of the Treasury shall cease issuing paper checks for all Federal disbursements, inclusive of intragovernmental payments,

benefits payments, vendor payments, and tax refunds, except as specified in section 4 of this order. The Secretary of the Treasury shall support agencies' transition to digital payment methods, including by providing access through the Department of the Treasury's centralized payment systems to:

- (i) direct deposits.
- (ii) debit and credit card payments.
- (iii) digital wallets and real-time payment systems; and
- (iv) Other modern electronic payment options.

CHAPLAIN: Hello Friends! We are officially registered for the American Legion Be the One Training: Saving Lives of Veterans, their Families, and Communities with the Columbia Protocol! The online Zoom training will be held in the Post Hall on Wednesday

29OCT25 from 5:30-7pm. As you all know, as part of The American Legion Be the One mission to end veteran suicide, we have joined forces with Columbia University (Columbia Lighthouse Project) to develop training for those who want to learn more about interacting and responding with veterans who may be in crisis. After the training, participants will be able to use the Columbia Suicide Severity Rating Scale to determine at-risk individuals, identify risk factors and warning signs, outline the types of suicidal ideation and four behaviors that indicate imminent risk, communicate effectively with an individual who may be at risk of hurting themselves. The American Legion has a goal to have 100,000 trained in suicide prevention by the end of 2025 - let's be a part of that goal! HONOR GUARDS CORNER: During September, the Honor Guard supported the Post by honoring our members who have passed away, celebrating the 78th birthday of the Air Force, and remembering our POW/MIA. We are always ready to support our community and Legion Family. We also wish the United States Navy a happy 250th Birthday on October 13th. October 26 is recognized as the National Day of the Deployed. This day began in 2006 thanks to Shelle Michaels Aberle from North Dakota. She was inspired by her cousin, Major David Hosna, who was serving in the military and had a birthday on that date. Aberle wanted to create a special day to honor all military personnel deployed away from home, ensuring they and their families felt appreciated and supported. With support from North Dakota's Governor John Hoeven, the first official proclamation for this day was made in 2006, making North Dakota the first state to recognize it. This grassroots effort helped spread the message of honoring deployed troops across the country. The holiday became nationally recognized when John Hoeven, who was the Governor of North Dakota and later a U.S. Senator, sponsored a resolution in 2011. This resolution was passed unanimously and officially designated October 26th as National Day of the Deployed. If you have any questions or requests, please contact Otha Newton.
