State Retirement Income Tax Latest Changes Virginia

Virginia military retirees 55 years and older will be able to keep more of their retirement income

thanks to language in the state budget passed this spring by the state's General Assembly.

Gov. Glenn Youngkin on June 21 signed the two-year budget, which exempts the first \$10.000 in

military retirement income in the 2022 tax year. This number will jump to \$20,000 in 2023,

\$30,000 in 2024, and \$40,000 in 2025 and beyond. The new law also applies to surviving spouses

of military retirees. That's an estimated \$575 in tax relief per \$10,000 of exemptions.

Retirees from the U.S. Public Health Service or NOAA will not be eligible for exemptions.

SPREAD The WORD Suicide Helpline. Effective 16 July 2022, "988" will serve as the new direct dial number for the National Suicide Prevention Helpline

PACT ACT

- The PACT Act is a new law that expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits and other toxic substances.
- Expands and extends eligibility for VA health care for Veterans with toxic exposures and Veterans of the Vietnam, Gulf War, and post-9/11 eras.
- 3. Adds more than 20 new presumptive conditions for burn pits and other toxic exposures.
- 4. Adds more presumptive-exposure locations for Agent Orange and radiation.
- Requires VA to provide a toxic exposure screening to every Veteran enrolled in VA health care. More info at va.gov/pact.
